
Upcoming Road Maintenance

Fire Danger Awareness

The RHCSD has quite a large amount of open space and our lands border Sacramento County and Highway 50 which puts the District at a much greater risk for fire. Chief Dave Roberts (El Dorado Hills Fire Dep.) stated that due to our location (right at the County Line) emergency calls which are usually from a cell phone are directed to the closest tower which happens to be Sacramento County.

If using a cell phone to report any fire emergency call (530-647-5250) in order to speed up the response process. Of course, any calls from a landline would be directed based on the address the telephone line originates from.

Financial Health of the District - FY 2016

The final operating budget for fiscal year 2015-16 was approved on July 21. Through diligent efforts, expenditures for routine operations and maintenance continue to be in line with regular revenues derived from a percentage of the property taxes collected and the special assessment levied for each parcel in the amount of \$200 per year. The adopted budget anticipates a shot in the arm this year as a result of the negotiated park and recreation development impact fee which will be paid to the District when the new El Dorado Springs development receives final Subdivision Map approval. That fee will be utilized to fund improvements and during this budget year a portion of the proceeds will offset the need for a draw on existing fund reserves to pay for needed five year road maintenance.

The District continues its efforts toward adoption of a Master Plan, the goal of which is to address recreational opportunities reflecting the values and preferences of residents and budgeting for future increased maintenance costs for existing infrastructure and new capital projects. Specific goals include: preserving natural resources, maintaining infrastructure, providing diverse recreational opportunities, promoting health and wellness, achieving financial stability and developing community partnerships. A component of the Plan is a Reserve Study which is a valuable budget planning tool used to anticipate and prepare for major project and infrastructure repair and replacement costs. The Reserve Study consists of a physical analysis of the current condition of the major infrastructure components the District is required to maintain, a financial analysis of the reserve balance (measured by percent funded), and a recommended funding plan to offset the anticipated reserve expenses. As the roads, drainage, and other infrastructure age, this funding plan becomes of even greater importance.

Illegal Vehicle Trespass



Winterfield Drive - New Boulders and Fire Access Gate

Due to ongoing issues with vehicles going off road on CSD property and causing potentially hazardous fire conditions, the District installed natural barricades at common vehicle entrance locations (Stonebriar Drive - near Prima Drive) and Dunnwood Drive) to eliminate further illegal trespassing on District open spaces. The District allows for pedestrian access and enjoyment of open spaces but would like to ask that all litter is packed back out with you when you exit the District property. El Dorado County Sec. 8.42.700. - Littering, accumulation of litter, and illegal dumping prohibited. Signs are posted prohibiting vehicle access, so if you see a motorcycles trespassing, please contact the El Dorado Sheriff's Department so that they can address the situation.

Nothing erodes property values more than entering into a community with shabby deteriorating roads. Current revenues are insufficient to fund reserves for future 10 year and 30 year cycle road maintenance costs which include sealing road cracks in the 10 year cycle and 2" asphalt overlay work required in the 30 year maintenance cycle. The asphalt overlay work is projected as an \$800,000 expense for which a funding plan is needed. The Board is cognizant of these issues and will continue to report on its progress and recommendations to achieve a long term sustainable financial plan.
